



## Introduction

Tipperary County Council, in partnership with Limerick City and County Council, Transport Infrastructure Ireland and the Department of Transport are progressing the N24 Cahir to Limerick Junction Project. The overall aim of the N24 project is to deliver a reliable and sustainable transport solution that will encourage balanced regional development and improve the quality of life of residents along this corridor.

## Project Progress Update

The project is currently at Phase 3 (Design and Environmental Evaluation).

The design of the Preferred Transport Solution is being progressed by the design team who are taking on board feedback received following the publication of the Design Update No. 1 in January 2023 and during one-to-one landowner meetings.

Environmental and topographical surveys continue within an area which includes, but is not limited to, the corridor for the road component for the Preferred Transport Solution and will continue over the coming months. Letters have been issued to inform landowners of these surveys.

Equally, non-intrusive archaeological geophysics surveys started in March 2023 and directly affected landowners were informed by letter of these surveys. The purpose of these surveys is to identify the extent of any potential subsurface archaeological remains or any geophysical anomalies in the areas surrounding any known existing archaeology.

Ground investigations continue on site and directly affected landowners have been informed by letter of these investigations.

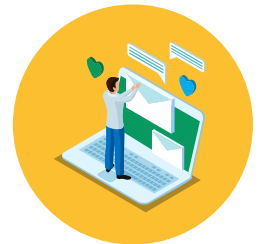


As part of our studies on the design and environmental evaluation, a noise monitoring programme has started to assess the existing environment in the vicinity of the corridor for the road component of the Preferred Transport Solution. An integral part of this monitoring programme involves the measurement of noise levels at selected locations over a 24-hour period.

## What Happens Next

The design team will further progress the road component and active travel components of the Preferred Transport Solution to incorporate feedback from stakeholder engagement and any mitigation measures identified from the environmental studies. The project team continue to be available to discuss the design and are available for in-person meetings or site visits.
