



## Introduction

Tipperary County Council, in partnership with Limerick City and County Council, Transport Infrastructure Ireland and the Department of Transport are progressing the N24 Cahir to Limerick Junction Project. The overall aim of the N24 project is to deliver a reliable and sustainable transport solution that will encourage balanced regional development and improve the quality of life of residents along this corridor.

## Project Progress Update

Following a detailed appraisal of the potential active travel routes previously published in January 2023, an active travel corridor has been identified within which active travel facilities will be provided where a specific need has been identified.



The Active Travel Component aims to encourage walking and cycling for work, school and leisure, linking communities, promoting healthier lifestyles, and reducing transport emissions. The Active Travel Corridor is identified on Design Update No. 2 drawings available on [www.n24cahirlimerick.ie](http://www.n24cahirlimerick.ie).

As part of the design development for the road component, there are a number of locations where deviations from the corridor previously published in January 2023 are currently being considered by the Design Team and accordingly the corridor has been extended at these locations. These extended areas of the corridor are identified on Design Update No. 2 drawings on [www.n24cahirlimerick.ie](http://www.n24cahirlimerick.ie).

The Project Liaison Officer held individual online and in person meetings with landowners as part of this Design Update No. 2.

On site ground investigations are substantially complete with the remaining elements to be completed in the coming weeks. The Project Liaison Officer has been in permanent contact with affected landowners to coordinate the completion of these works.

Additional topographic and hydrographic surveys to inform the design of the active travel component and the drainage design for the road component are now complete.

## What Happens Next

Additional archaeology investigations are expected to be carried out in some areas along the Project. The Project Liaison Officer will be in contact with affected landowners to discuss further.



The project team will continue to progress the design and environmental evaluation of the Project taking on board any feedback from Design Update No. 2.
